In 2022, we distributed the following: 1,370 pajamas, 80 kids backpack with school supplies, hundreds of pairs of socks, almost 200 knitted items, a multitude of stuffies, lots of kid's books and hundreds of other misc. new gifts. Thank you for making this possible.

We held our Annual General Meeting in October by Zoom. # Cythera Transition House Society

**Mission** – To achieve a balance of power in society which, we believe, will bring about an end to violence and abuse of women and children. Cythera strives to bring an end to domestic violence through transitional housing, counselling, education and access to additional community resources.

**Our Transition House** provides safe housing and basic necessities for up to 30 days to women and children impacted by domestic violence and/or abuse. Staffed 24 hours a day, residents receive emotional support in a secure, nonjudgmental and confidential environment. Practical information and referrals to service providers to support with housing, legal rights, income assistance, child-care and other community resources are provided.



When you arrive – Every individual who comes to the Transition House is greeted by our staff and given access to a secure private room and clean pajamas. Our staff strive to create a welcoming and comfortable home environment where you will find a fully stocked kitchen, toys and games for young children to enjoy, a gaming lounge for youth. Our transition house also features a beautifully landscaped yard complete with toys, playhouses, gardens and a covered deck area.

# Reflections – from W.I.N.G.S Newsletter

As a result of the pandemic, we have all experienced change. For a season we adjusted to new routines, the loss of freedoms we previously enjoyed, and the lessening of the control and personal autonomy we were accustomed to. The thought, "Oh, I can't do that or I can't go there", became a familiar refrain in our consciousness. A sense of fear for our personal safety dogged our footsteps. We felt isolated and deprived. Do you realize what we all experienced was a small glimpse of what life looks like everyday for a woman in an abusive relationship? For her, not just during the pandemic but every day before the pandemic and every day now. There is no hope for her of regaining a sense of 'normal' life. That life with limited personal freedom and choice is her normal life. The spike in violent domestic incidents over the last three years just represents a new layer of oppression for her and other women, a deeper level of danger, and fewer exit points.

Abuse affects everything. At some point, you might have been stopped at a train crossing and waited for what seemed like 'forever' for the train to pass. You only saw a section of the train at any one moment in time but you had a sense of the length of the entire train. Her life is like that train, constantly moving toward a destination, adding cars that drain her capacity and weigh her down. She cannot stop that train and the challenge of getting off is both perilous and uncertain. The women and children we served this year made that courageous choice and we were there to come alongside, supporting their journey to safety.
