Message from the President

We are mindful of our Vision (A society without domestic violence where everyone is safe and respected in their own home) and our Mission (to help victims of domestic violence while raising awareness of the impact it has on our communities) as we continue our charitable work. We are blessed to work together with many generous partners and supporters like you. But, until we can celebrate a community free of domestic violence, there will be victims that need our help.

We do three dispersals each year to Transition Houses in the Lower Mainland: Spring, Aug/Sep and Fall. The Spring and Fall distributions include seasonally appropriate new pajamas and whatever miscellaneous donated goods we have received. Some of the pajamas are donated and many more are purchased with donated funds. We contact the houses each cycle to find out the quantity of pjs required. The third distribution takes place in late August or early September in time for back to school. We provide backpacks with some basic school supplies courtesy of SPI Health and Safety Inc. None of this would be possible without you. Thank you so much for your ongoing loyal support.

Over the years, we have distributed more than 14,000 pajamas for women, boys and girls, 1,296 backpacks and countless toys, books, gift cards, personal hygiene products, beautiful handcrafted items and more. We also ship our specialized children's workbooks "THERE'S ONLY ONE ME!" (4,640 to date) and our monthly planners (101,590 to date) upon request to charities all over BC.

Tri-City Transition Society was founded in 1975 and is a respected and established registered charity providing emergency shelter and social support for women and their children.

The Society is here to help victims get their life back on track and start their journey to peace.

Joy's Place is a secure transition house that provides a temporary safe shelter and support for women and their dependent children who are victims of domestic violence or are at risk of experiencing abuse, threats and/or violence. Joy's Place bridges the gap between the woman's abusive household and their new, safe home.

Joy's Place is Tri-City Transitions' second-stage home program that provides a safe haven for women and children who choose to move forward into Domestic Peace. At Joy's Place, they will receive temporary, subsidized, supportive housing that allows them to focus on their own strengths, resilience, independence, self-sufficiency and safety until they can secure a new home of their own.

Women (and their children 10 years of age and under) who have experienced violence can stay in independent living units or suites, safely away from the threat of family violence. While at Joy's Place, they support the victims through education, advocacy, victim services and family law support, workshops and counselling.

Other services include: Family Court Support, Victim Services, Children & Youth Support and Parenting Services.
